

Project Circuit






Context - Diversity

^{*}SAA = Self-accrediting Authority (a provider can self-accredit some or all of its courses)




Self-Accrediting and Quality Framework

Explore


 Common experiences, challenges and achievements as they relate to SAA

Data Collection


Two main approaches:

Self-Review

- Of participating institutions
- Online survey and oral interviews
 - Focus on attitudes and perceptions of SAA

Peer-Review

- Of data provided through selfreview
- Use to establish a profile of strengths and gaps
